<u>Text:</u>

Umar ibn al-Khattab (Umar, son of al-Khattab) was one of the most powerful and influential Muslim caliphs in history. He was born 13 years after the Elephant Year (584 CE). He was a tough and brave man: white skinned, tall, stout, sturdy and strong. At the pre-Islamic time of ignorance, he was educated by his father, al-Khattab, in a hard way. He was obliged to herd <u>his</u> camels every day. He got used to endure difficult and exhausting days which helped to shape him into a harsh man.

Before embracing Islam, Umar was among the harshest man in his hostility to Islam and the messenger of Allah-peace and prayer of Allah be upon him.

Umar converted to Islam in 616. He became a senior companion of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). He succeeded AbuBaker (632-634) as the second caliph of the Rashidun Caliphate on 23 August 634. He was an expert Muslim jurist known for his pious and just nature, which earned him the epithet Al-Farooq (the one <u>who</u> distinguishes between right and wrong).

Under Umar, the Caliphate expanded at an unprecedented rate, ruling the Sasanian Empire and more than two-thirds of the Byzantine Empire. His attacks against the Sasanian Empire resulted in the conquest of Persia in less than two years (642-644).

Umar was eventually killed by the Persian Piruz Nahavandi (known as Abu Luluah in Arabic) on 3 November 644 CE.
